## MCK CALL FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON THE DRAFT COLLEGE INSPECTION AND CURRICULUM ACCREDITATION GUIDELINES

Section 6 (f) of the Media Council Act 2013, mandates the Council to set standards, in consultation with the relevant training institutions, for professional education and the training of journalists. Accordingly, the Council developed the Journalism Curriculum for middle level colleges and has now drafted the College Inspection and Curriculum Accreditation Guidelines.

The guidelines seek to;

- 1. Provide guidance on curriculum application process for middle level colleges training journalism courses.
- 2. Ensure compliance by media training colleges
- 3. Provide clear steps on college inspection and accreditation procedures

By way of this notice, the Council wishes to notify members of the public, lecturers and colleges offering journalism courses to submit their input and views on the draft College Inspection and Curriculum Accreditation Guidelines.
